For *JMR* this partnership brings expanded benefits such as 24 issues per year, no author page charges, free online color, and rapid online publication on Cambridge Journals Online (CJO). CJO features enhanced access, search, discovery and dissemination functionality such as social bookmarking, citation exports, and quick links to Top 10 Most Read Articles and Top 10 Most Cited Articles. CJO's Accepted *JMR* articles will now be published online—weeks before they are available in print—via CJO's First View.
