

# Biography

I'm a Lecturer in Chinese Studies in the School of Languages, Literatures, Cultures and Linguistics at Monash University. Before coming to Monash, I was a lecturer at Macquarie University; a postdoctoral fellow at the Institute for U.S.-China Issues at the University of Oklahoma; a visiting researcher on the LOEWE Research Focus project 'Extrajudicial and Judicial Conflict Resolution' at the Goethe University Frankfurt; and a research fellow at the Asia Research Institute at the National University of Singapore.

Before starting my academic career, I studied and worked in Australia, China, and Taiwan. I received my PhD from the University of Melbourne in 2010.

My monograph *Defending Rights in Contemporary China* was published by Routledge in 2013.

My current research concentrates on political communication in modern China, with particular emphasis on political campaigns, new media, visual culture, aesthetics, and the process of design. I am also interested in how Chinese culture and society are taught and learnt at secondary schools and universities in Australia. My earlier research focused on the development of the concept of rights in China and the ways in which rights are used to describe and resolve conflicts. Most of my teaching is in the two cornerstone units in the Chinese major, Understanding Modern China (ATS2039) and Understanding Contemporary China (ATS2040).
