Dr Malia Ho has a Bachelor of Podiatry (Hons) from the University of Salford (UK). She completed her Graduate Certificate in Adult and Tertiary Education in 2020. She was Head of Course of the Podiatry program at Central Queensland University. Prior to that, Malia worked as the Principal Sports Podiatrist in Singapore Sports Medicine Centre and has almost 20 years of clinical experience both in the private and public health sectors.
