Elias Khalil is an associate professor of economics at Monash University, Australia. He received his PhD in economics from the New School for Social Research in 1990. His research areas are behavioural economics and political economy. His research focus is the development of rational choice theory based on the emotions, on one hand, and moral judgment, on the other—in effect departing from the standard axiomatic approach. His papers appeared in journals such as *Economic Inquiry*, *Behavioral and Brain Sciences*, *Biology and Philosophy*, *Biological Theory*, *Theory and Decision*, *Journal of Economic Behavior and Organization*, *Cambridge Journal of Economics*, *Journal of Evolutionary Economics*, *International Negotiation*, *Theoria*, *Philosophy*, *Economic Modelling*, *Economics Letters*, and *Economics and Philosophy*.
